

The A & D Gotthard Scholarship in Electrical Engineering (UGCA1259)

Closing Date 30th September 2008

Value and Tenure

\$9,000 (tax exempt) per annum, tenable for up to four years subject to satisfactory progress (minimum credit average).

Outline

The Scholarship is established to encourage and assist high achieving students to undertake full-time studies in at least 24 Units of Credit per session, in the Bachelor of Engineering/Electrical Engineering program at the Kensington Campus of UNSW.

A new scholarship will normally only be offered when the current recipient has ceased to receive benefits.

Eligibility

To be eligible for a Scholarship an applicant must be completing the NSW HSC (or equivalent examination) in the year of application or the previous year (but must not have commenced tertiary study), and be proposing full-time study in the first year of a combined Bachelor of Engineering/Electrical Engineering program at UNSW.

Selection will be undertaken on the basis of financial hardship and other proven disadvantage which may hinder their successful transition to UNSW. Applicants will be assessed on interview performance, academic merit (UAI of at least 90), aptitude and commitment to the preferred program of study, and personal qualities (for example, extra-curricula activities, evidence of leadership skills and potential to contribute to the wider life of the University).

Applicants must be Australian citizens or permanent residents by 31 October of the year preceding commencement of the Bachelor of Engineering program.

Students undertaking other qualifying programs such as the University Preparation Program (UPP) or TAFE Courses are not eligible for the scholarship.

The Scholarship recipient should not normally hold any other Scholarship or Award (except for Youth Allowance/ Austudy/ Abstudy/ Commonwealth Learning Scholarship) except with the permission of the Manager of the UNSW Scholarships Office.

How to Apply

An application form is available which must be completed and lodged together with any supporting documentation by the closing date. Please ensure that you have read and understood the application form and have included ALL requested information and documentation.

Applications which are late, incomplete or unsigned will not be accepted.
